


President's Message

Editor's Musings

Dear Friends,

Lately there has been a buzz around the new artificial intelligence (AI) application in the form of ChatGPT (Generative Pre-trained Transformer). Naysayers have been vociferous against the technology, fearing that its application in medicine can lead to catastrophic clinical mistakes and that it will flare-up plagiarism. I grant that there is some merit in the argument, but that is only when ChatGPT has an unfettered free run in clinical medicine, which certainly is neither the aim, nor the claim, of OpenAI – the innovators of ChatGPT. It is more like a clinical assistant to the physician, in the mould of a ready-reckoner for knowledge; can even help decluster some administrative tasks, so that the clinician has more time at his disposal to deliver personal touch to patient care.



These new technologies are especially felicitous for the busy bee cardio-thoracic surgeons who are always bereft of time. ChatGPT can be a great ally to set in motion the process of writing for a publication and for such mundane jobs as compilation of references. However, I want to issue a caveat here – ChatGPT is still a very unreliable tool and human oversight is a mandatory prerequisite for its use. Moreover, it is only as good as the master who controls it and, therefore, the framing of questions and terms of reference for ChatGPT are of paramount importance. Needless to say, all responsibility and accountability for any misdemeanor on part of ChatGPT lie with the human author and, therefore, it should be used with due diligence.

Just as I am penning this piece down came the news last evening that Google too has launched its Chatbot called 'Bard'. Certainly, times ahead are exciting, with artificial intelligence all geared to break big in 'Medicine', especially in scientific publications. Whether this is good or bad news, I shall leave for another day, intending to address matters in an Editorial for May-June issue of IJTC – Be on the lookout.

As for a valedictory epilogue from me – 'Adopt' rather than 'shun' technology, as it may turn out to be the best 'Friend, Philosopher and Guide' to us, that ever was. A little cheeky – what say you!

Recently Concluded Events

IACTS SCORE 2023



The seventh recension of the IACTS SCORE was conducted on the 4th & 5th of March, 2023, at Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Bengaluru. The program brought together academicians and clinicians, and their experience in the specialties of CTVS to render maximum exposure, rapid revision, and know-how crucial in clinical life.

Day 1 started with an inaugural address by Chief Guest Dr. Minu Bajpai, Executive Director of the National Board of Examinations. In his welcome address, the Organising Secretary IACTS SCORE Dr C. S Hiremath briefed the attendees on what's in store over the two days and how students must prepare for the DrNB practical examinations.

The sessions started with three clinical case presentations: two cyanotic and an acyanotic case. Students partook in these and garnered tips and techniques for the DrNB practical examination. The clinical case discussion began with case presentation, followed by investigation, and covered the entire surgical steps and perioperative complications. In a virtual session, international faculty member Dr. Ali Zamir Khan took the residents through how

to present a thoracic case. Other sessions of the day included masterclasses on the basics of chest X-ray by Dr. Anil G Tendolkar, ECG by Dr. V Devagourou, Transthoracic and transesophageal echo by Dr. Muralidhar Kanchi, and CT MRI for cardiac surgery by Dr. Sanjeev Kumar.

Dr. Adarsh S Koppula delivered a popular topic of interest on how to improve memory and recall as well as the do's and don'ts of being a cardiac surgeon. The end of Day 1 saw active participation of students with experienced faculty Dr. Anil G Tendolkar, Dr. Prasanna Simha Mohan Rao, and Dr. Vinayak Shukla in discussions on instruments and the basics of CPB.

DAY 2 started with an interactive session on CAG and cath study by Dr. Prasanna Simha, who involved students themselves to answer most of the questions that came up. The crash course for residents continued with the fundamentals of IABP by Dr. Pradeep Narayan and the fundamentals of VA ECMO by Dr. O P Sanjay. There was also a second round of clinical presentations on valvular heart disease, thoracic case, and redo cardiac surgery. Other interesting discussions included palliative surgeries by Dr. K.S Iyer, pulmonary artery hypertension by Dr. Parvathi U. Iyer and a choice of

patch and conduit material by Dr. B. R. Jagannath. The final part of the program was a novel interactive session on case scenarios on the more commonly seen ones in CTVS ICU by Dr. Prasanna Simha.

IACTS SCORE 2023 was well received with very positive feedback from the delegates. Residents found this year's sessions to be more interactive than in the past years with each case discussion being very elaborate.





IACTSCON 2023, Coimbatore





The 69th Annual Conference of the Indian Association of Cardiovascular Thoracic Surgeons (IACTSCON 2023) was held from February 16-19, 2023, at Le Meridien, Coimbatore. Themed "From Grassroots to Innovation", the annual conference was an in-person event with a special virtual session on Day 1 in conjunction with the American Association of Thoracic Surgery (AATS).

IACTSCON 2023 Coimbatore was replete with lectures, panel discussions, symposia, industry-sponsored workshops, video sessions, and social events. More than 1400 delegates attended this annual meeting. It was a good opportunity to learn new approaches, share ideas, exchange views, and network with members of the CTVS community from across the world. As in the past, a half-day symposium exclusively for nurses was held on the last day of the conference. IACTSCON 2023 also hosted a specially-curated program for physician assistants.

The conference also hosted the 69th Annual General Body Meeting of the Association on Day 2 of the conference with fellow and life members in attendance. Coinciding with the AGM was a Resident's Forum organised for CTVS residents.

There were plenty of networking opportunities amongst surgeons and interactions with pharmaceutical and medical-surgical device industry partners. Gala dinners with cultural entertainment were thoroughly enjoyed with spectacular fireworks displays at the close of the night.








Scientific sessions

The 4-day scientific feast has not been covered in its entirety in this section due to the sheer number of sessions; a valiant attempt has been made to present glimpses of a few scientific sessions in each sub-speciality based on comperes' reports and feedback. This by no means is intended to take away the noteworthy contributions made by all the faculty members not mentioned here.

The conference opened with a special virtual session by AATS, clinical trials in the field of coronary artery revascularization, recent advances in lung cancer management, and valve repairs in infants were presented.



This session was followed by several talks by senior faculty members on coronary, paediatric, aortic, valvular surgery and transplantation. The session on 'Valves in the Indian scenario' was much appreciated by the residents.

On Days 2,3, and 4, parallel sessions were in progress to cover the super specialities in cardiac surgery. Workshops sponsored by Medtronic, Abbott, J&J, and Edwards were held as breakout sessions.

Twenty-five select participants gained immensely from the workshop conducted by Dr. Sivakumar Sivalingam (Malaysia) on the Ozaki Procedure.



The adult cardiac surgery sessions saw many invigorating lectures as did valvular surgery. Amongst them, two interesting techniques were discussed with riveting videos on infra axillary DVR and totally endoscopic valve surgery.

There were several interactive symposia in paediatric cardiac surgery such as on root translocation with APCHSS, hypoplastic left heart syndrome, single ventricle with APCHSS, mechanical support devices, and airway surgeries in children. A special invited lecture on 'Biventricular repair in borderline hearts' was delivered by Dr. Joseph Dearani from Mayo Clinic. The CCTGA segment was very interesting, with the legendary Dr. Robert H Anderson making the anatomy of CCTGA look very simple.

Dr. Krishna S. Iyer, the Chairman of the IACTS National Database, presented the current progress in the database, while Dr. Pradeep Narayan shared with the audience the key highlights of the SCS-STS adult cardiac surgery database. The ensuing interactions resulted in a consensus among the audience that a unified national database is indeed the need of the hour, which only underlined the importance of enrolling into the IACTS National Database.

Dr. Murali Vettah promoted the 'Make in India' philosophy by sharing his original designs of stabilising systems and many other innovations. Dr. Piroze Davierwala explained in great detail how one can successfully start a MICS program; the key ingredients being persistence and tenacity. Dr. Dhiren Shah shared the valuable lessons learnt in his journey to set up a heart transplant program in the country.



The first two mornings of the conference saw exclusive video sessions in all the subspecialities at the amphitheatre. Another novel segment in the conference (on Day 1) was the Thoracic MDT. This session saw case presentations by junior doctors. It provided a wealth of knowledge where lung malignancy was discussed comprehensively right from preoperative evaluation to management strategies. More importantly, how a multidisciplinary team effort can enhance patient outcomes was very well brought out by the stellar panel of international thoracic surgeons.





The nurses symposium covered topics such as trends in cardiothoracic nursing, protocols, preand post-operative nursing care for CTVS patients, cardiovascular diseases during pregnancies, and work-life balance for nurses. There was also an exclusive symposium for physician assistants held at hotel Gokulam Park, close by to the main venue.



The conference held a unique distinction in that seven women CTVS residents from across India were trained as comperes to introduce the speakers for each scientific session. This was an initiative to encourage women leadership and promote inclusivity in cardiac surgery.





Presidential Oration

Dr. Zile Singh Meharwal rendered his presidential oration as the outgoing 53rd President of the Indian Association of Cardiovascular Thoracic Surgeons. He was felicitated for his notable services to the Association. Prior to this, an introduction was presented by Secretary Dr. C.S. Hiremath accompanied by a video encapsulating Dr. Meharwal's life and work to date.

Updates

Mentorship at Your Doorstep

The IACTS Mentorship at Your Doorstep is an initiative to help young surgeons effectively deal with and rise above surgical challenges. It rests on the premise that mentors voluntarily share their experience and expertise to contribute to an early surgeon's career and personal development. Mentors provide crucial motivation for a mentee to excel in a chosen subspecialty. A mentee can seek guidance from more than one mentor.

The Secretary's Office plays a pivotal role in coordinating and scheduling the Mentor-Mentee meeting. The Association provides administrative, travel, and logistics support to the Mentor. The Mentor will only be responsible for clearing their calendar for the stipulated duration of the meeting.

Application forms were released via email to all the Association members early this year. Six of the nine applications received were shortlisted. The due diligence process and finding a suitable match with a mentor is ongoing.

For those who missed the details of the program, this is how it works.

- Senior surgeons are invited to volunteer for the program. In parallel, applications from mentees are sought.
- 2. The Secretary's Office vets these applications and proposes the Mentor-Mentee match.
- 3. The Mentor and Mentee arrive at the goals for the mentorship.
- 4. The Mentor meets with the Mentee at their institute and spends the planned time. It may be in terms of handholding at surgeries, making plans for the department, or developing the Mentee as a leader.
- 5. Both the Mentor and the Mentee submit a summary of their interaction and learnings to the Secretary.
- 6. The Mentor follows up with the Mentee as necessary.

Obituary

He will be remembered and missed for his service to humankind through the practice of cardiothoracic surgery. We pray for the bereaved to find the strength to cope with their loss.



Prof. Mohammad Hanif Beg

Cardiothoracic surgeon Prof. Mohammad Hanif Beg graduated from King George's Medical University, Lucknow, in 1976. Thereafter, he did his M.S. (General Surgery) and M.Ch (CVTS) from PGIMER, Chandigarh, in 1980 and 1982, respectively. He did his MNAMS (DNB) in General Surgery and Cardiothoracic surgery in 1980 and 1982, respectively.

Prof. Beg had joined the Department of General Surgery at Jawahar Lal Nehru Medical College, Aligarh Muslim University, as a young, dynamic, and enthusiastic teacher In January 1983. We have witnessed him performing closed mitral valvotomy at JNMC, AMU with minimal

resources. I had the chance to assist him in a few CMVs and thoracic surgeries such as Pneumonectomy and Lobectomies. The time when Dr. Beg had joined, I was in the final year and his very first lecture had been on "Institution of Cardiopulmonary Bypass". I also had the opportunity to work with him as a house surgeon. He had been my real mentor. He was dedicated and saw him continuously monitoring the patients in the postoperative ICU in OR complex with a very primitive monitor. He had only developed that ICU. During his stay at JNMC, AMU he had contributed immensely to the development of Cardiothoracic surgery. He had been an eminent academician, a wonderful teacher, and a good human being and served in cardiothoracic surgery for over four decades.

He held several posts as Chairman - Department of Surgery, Director - Centre of Cardiology and Cardiovascular Research, Dean - Faculty of Medicine and Principal of JNMC, AMU, Aligarh.

He had been suffering from ill health for the last few years and breathed his last on the morning of 06.04.2023. May his soul rest in peace.
