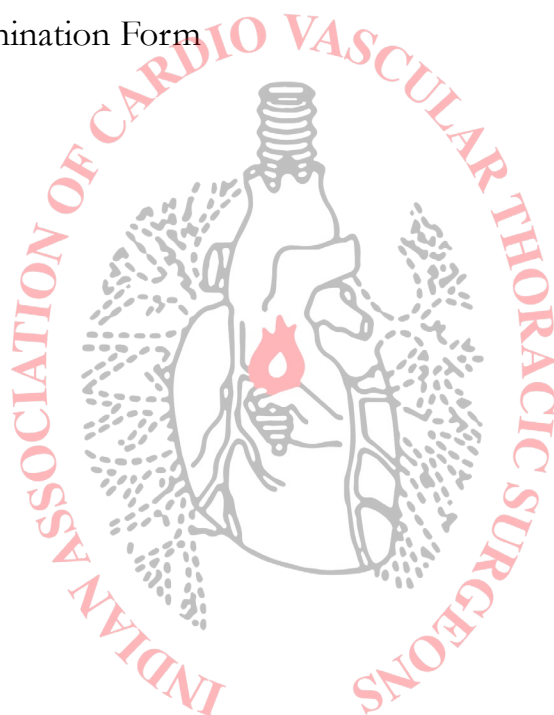

Preface

Fellow Colleagues,

The procedure crafted by Blalock & Thomas, with unrelenting support from their cardiology colleague Dr. Helen Taussig has been to the advantage of many tots & adults from India who continue to suffer from congenital heart disease. It has been the collective effort of many teams over the years in India, to offer this mode from the humble armamentarium to tackle the vast array of congenital heart lesions. In this relentless effort, we do not know, exactly how many children have benefitted from such procedures & their whereabouts thereafter.

I believe it is our responsibility as a collective group of surgical specialists to document the numbers & progress of such children, in their transit from surgery to further stages of life. The association has taken up a more proactive approach to implement a working database project at the national level through its reach. This will get us on the right path leading towards developing a more prudent understanding into the epidemiology, incidence and outcomes of lesions we see in our sector. Editor's Musings



Time yet again friends for a pow-wow. In our series of special thematic issues, the last issue on 'Aortic Valve Surgery' was well received and thanks for all the kudos heaped on us. We couldn't have done that without your patronage and contribution of our Guest Editors and learned Authors. Thanks folks.

The next and the sixth special issue in the series is on 'Valve Repairs' and should be in your hands almost pari-passu with the publication of this communication. Dr. P. Chandrasekar from Coimbatore took the lead for this issue and I can't thank him enough. I hope the issue meets your approval.

Currently for multitude of reasons, valve repairs is a laggard in India. Partly it's due to the underlying rheumatic substrate with its attendant inflammation, fibrosis, cicatrization and calcification making valve repairs not only technically demanding, but even the results are inferior to those with degenerative pathologies. Equally, or at least significantly, the reluctance of the surgeons to take to repairs confounds matters. The concept of a 'Reference Mitral Surgeon' in a 'Centre of Excellence' only doing mitral valve repair, though may sound ideal, but shall always remain a Platonic Utopian dream in India. I just can not foresee any cardiac surgeon referring a patient with mitral pathology to another more accomplished colleague for a repair, rather than his replacing the valve himself, for more than one reasons – Ego and Financial to name a few. Its therefore practically and pragmatically relevant that we train all our cardiac surgeons and equip them with at least basic skill sets necessary for simple mitral valve repairs, hoping that they would blossom with time. The learning curve should be accepted and exonerated by the administrators of the hospitals. Accomplished surgeons and centers organizing workshops for valve repairs and inviting junior colleagues to see a televised version of the same, though rampant and an effective marketing exercise, lacks any merit as a training exercise.

I think, those of us gifted with skills for repair of the valves should be willing to reach out to our colleagues and train them on their own turf, on their patients, as a hands-on exercise. Its only then shall the sub-speciality of 'valve repairs' come to fruition.

IACTS CT CME and Midterm GBM

The midterm CME program was held on the 17 & 18 of August 2019 at the Chirayu Medical College and Hospital in the City of the Lakes - Bhopal.

Themed on getting back to basics, a unique itinerary was crafted by Dr. Vivek M. Kanhere and team wherein the conclave was held on the premise of equipping our exam going registrars and residents with basic fundamentals and fortifying them with do, don'ts and experiences from experienced faculty. With conceptual background and theoretical base, the students were exposed to methodologies and techniques elucidated as is pictured in sequence so as to accrue clarity and understanding to bridge gaps in the process of learning.

The first day began with a simple and elegant inaugural, with office bearers of the association and senior faculty lighting the lamp, a testament of knowledge and learning. The sessions concentrated on congenital surgery, surgery of the valves and coronary surgery.

Special sessions with video-demonstrations on basics were organized with experienced senior faculty for impending good practice and for good practice to be adopted by the trainees.

While the first day of the conclave ended with wet-labs and dinner, the second day of the conclave started with hands-on labs, followed by sessions on surgery for heart-failure, research in practice and legal perspectives in medicine. The session concluded with lunch.

With 26 post-graduate students in participation, wet-labs and hands-on demonstrations were organized in congenital lesions in porcine specimens (Dr. Tendolkar, Dr. Suresh Rao), endoscopic vessel harvest (Dr. Manoj Pradhan), Bentall procedure (Dr. V.V Bashi), Valve Replacement (Dr. P. Chandrasekar) and donor-organ harvest (Dr. Manoj Durairaj).

IACTS Thoracic CME

The Thoracic CME for postgraduates and junior faculty was held at the Government Medical College, Jammu on the 15 and 16 of December, 2019. High-tech teaching modules including the hands-on experience on the Endobronchial Ultrasound, commonly referred to as EBUS within the Thoracic community. The icing atop the conclave was the hands-on session on the DaVinci, for the first time in an Indian CME.

TACS - TAVR Program

The first edition of Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement(Implantation) was conducted for practicing members of the Indian Association of Cardiovascular-Thoracic Surgeons, in association with TACS Academy in Chennai on the 5th & 6th of September 2019, at Park Hyatt, Chennai.

A first of its kind entity, the program solicited applications from surgeons across the country who preserve a curiosity to understand the intricacies & modalities involved in offering transcatheter valvar therapies. This was also a forum for them to have their queries & clarifications redressed by experts & pioneers curating this in the country. All applications submitted were scrutinized by a selection panel.

A dedicated certificate course to train cardiac surgeons towards becoming primary TAVR operators and integral part of heart teams has been put forward by IACTS in collaboration with experienced teams and industry support. This was a new initiative by IACTS in the interest of expanding the surgeon's knowledge and handling of this exponentially expanding and evidence-based treatment namely TAVR.

The course had several didactic lectures & case scenario-discussions in the interest of all first-time attendees, with focused sessions on case selection, imaging in TOE/CT/MR, and hybrid approaches.

The novelty of the course was in the extensive hands-on simulated training with simulated scenarios, wire/sheath/catheters handling, with valve in valve implantation and in the box training.

A positive & satisfactory feedback was obtained for the same.

The resource persons for the course were Dr. Prashanth Vaijyanath(Course coordinator), Dr. A.B Gopalumurugan(Course coordinator), Dr. Anantharaman, Dr. Naman Shastri, Dr. Karthikeyan & Dr. Zeeshan.

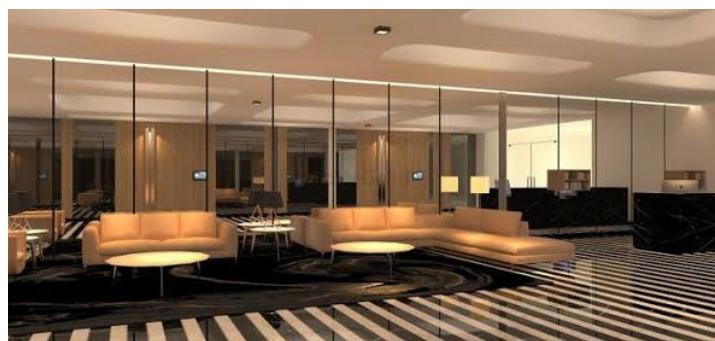
