PROPOSED AMENDMENTS IN THE BYE-LAWS OF IACTS RULES AND REGULATIONS

Article No.2 – Membership

Proposed: Decision of the Executive Board shall be final. Membership shall comprise of Six Categories namely:

- Fellows
- · Life Member
- Honorary Fellows
- Overseas Life Members
- Associate Member (Cardiac)
- Associate Member (Non Cardiac)

Members and Overseas members are removed.

Presently all ordinary members are elected as Life Members.

A Life Member or Overseas Life Member of Association who has completed Five years is eligible for fellowship.

Proposed change for fellowship: 8 years

Article No. 3 – Privileges of Membership

- Sub headings to be inserted
- Withdrawal of privileges
- Membership funds

Article No. 5 - Executive Committee

Diplomas - Deleted

Article No. 6 - Election

- Secretary shall call for nominations in October.
- Last date and time for filling a nomination paper shall be 31st December.
- Withdrawal of nomination can be made by 1st February.

Article No. 9 - Meetings

- Scientific committee meeting protocol for the IACTS Annual Conference.
- It shall be called as IACTSCON year, Place - (Eg. IACTSCON 2013, Mumbai).
- Notifications for abstracts, articles, and papers for the conferences by 1st June.
- Visit and confirmation of venue by 31st June.
