INAUGURATION

The Day 1 started with the welcome address by the Organising chairman and brief introduction of Kanpur Institute by the organising secretary.

The Scientific sessions took off on time with Dr. Balram Airan's talk on the Growth of Cardiac surgery in India last 60 yrs, with a look into past and a look into the future. Delegates more than 150 members were present from across the country. Dr K M Cherian the doyen of cardiac surgery in India elaborated on the need for advances in Cardiothoracic & vascular surgery that stressed on 'Make in India' products regarding conduits, valves, and pericardium and ignited the young brains for more research activities.

We then had the forum in coronary artery disease where renowned coronary surgeons shared their knowledge and experience with us. The informative talks stressed on the use of radial artery, the benefits of Off pump surgery compared to On pump CABG and the innovative, creative arterial grafting with the intention to give arterial grafts to patients. Esteemed surgeon Dr. Yugal Mishra spoke on MID CAB. Dr. S.S Bhattacharyya, who is a pioneer and master on total arterial revascularization, enlightened us with his talk on challenges in Redo CABG.

There was a panel discussion on the management of post MI Ventricular septal rupture [VSR] with Dr. Vivek Jawali as the moderator. The various approaches and techniques done by various senior surgeons Dr. Shiv Nair, Dr. V. Bashi & Cardiologist Dr. Ramesh Thakur were highlighted.

Post lunch session we had the valvular heart disease forum. It was quite an interesting session with various talks on basics, the approach to valve surgeries, valve repairs, the ideal valve substitutes and the choice of mechanical or tissue valves in the Indian context by legendary surgeons

The talk on wire skills for cardiac surgeons gave us a push to acquire new skills to benefit our patients. The talk on 'Errors and near misses- in cardiac surgery' cautioned us to set our protocols strong and pick up mishaps at the earliest to correct them in order to avoid disasters.

The last session of the day was a workshop on 'Accidents on Cardiopulmonary bypass'. It was a very interactive and dynamic session conducted by Dr. Prasanna Simha and Dr. C S Hiremath with active participation by all the residents on the management of various scenarios which could go wrong during the conduct of the CPB.

Inauguration of the CME was done by Chief Guest Smt. Neelima Gupta, Vice Chancellor of Kanpur University who highlighted the need of many more good cardiac surgeons in our country. She also thanked IACTS for giving an opportunity to conduct a CME in Kanpur city for the first time and also the organising team members for an excellent scientific feast and hospitality. OBITUARY



Dr Ram Mohan Aug 1959- July 2018 Dr Ram Mohan was a great friend to many and a great inspiration to his juniors. A good raconteur he can be up whole nights entertaining friends or monitoring patients.

After finishing MBBS and MS from Tirupathy he did his DNB in Dr MRG'S unit. Subsequently he was a consultant surgeon at the Vijaya Hospital in Chennai and for the last couple of years in Sunshine Hospital Hyderabad.

A voracious reader and a keen observer he was always ready to suggest a fine solution to a tricky problem in the ICU. His interest outside the speciality was wide ranging but the most visible was driving to the consternation of his friends he used to drive down to most of our annual conferences rather than flying and mostly alone.

He was a good surgeon and a great human being. He leaves behind a treasure trove of memories in people who were fortunate to have spent time with him. He is survived by his wife Parvati an ophthalmologist and two sons who are in US.



Dr I Mrityunjay Rao was the son of an illustrious father, the late Dr Joga Rao a famous Surgeon of Kakinada. He was a topper at the medical college at Vizag from where he graduated and obtained his Masters degree in Surgery. He then joined the AIIMS for his Magister Chirurgiae degree in Cardiothoracic Surgery under Prof N Gopinath. He was a brilliant student and developed a special interest in Pediatric Cardiac Surgery. He was a contemporary of the



late Prof M R S Menon, Prof. P Venugopal and Dr Girinath. After getting his MCh he joined the AIIMS Faculty and worked there till he got the opportunity to work with Sir Brian G Barratt- Boyes at the Green Lane Hospital, Auckland. He then returned to the AIIMS where he continued for a few years and then got a chance to set up Pediatric Heart Surgery at Abu Dhabi. After his return to India he has been working at the Innova and more recently at the Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences being well into his seventies.

Dr I M Rao was passionate about Pediatric Cardiac Surgery and had an encyclopediac knowledge of the morphology of complex congenital heart disease. A very pleasant and friendly person, he inspired many. He is survived by his wife Dr Meera, a radiologist and two children.
