

## From the President's desk

Dearest Members,

Greetings! These are exciting and uplifting times we are in. I write this note in the wake of a hugely successful Mid Term CME held by Professor Alok Sharma, Dr. Ajit Bana and the team of surgeons at AIIMS, Jodhpur. The theme of the CME was 'Minimal Is the Future". It was gratifying to see the innovative approaches adopted routinely by our younger generation of surgeons who showcased their excellent results via the Trans Axillary and Endoscopic approaches. It is something we all need to be proud of and their efforts need to be commended. The IACTS Executive planned a unique set of activities for our members offering Hands-on and focused group-based training sessions. These "Skill Enhancement Programmes" commenced with a hands-on TRANSCATHETER valve replacement Workshop at Epic Hospital, Ahmedabad under the leadership of Dr. Anil Jain and Dr. Abhishek Rajpopat (Structural Heart Cardiologist) on the 8th and 9th of September 2024.



The IACTS - EPIC workshop was an IACTS-certified workshop. Four transcatheter procedures were posted in EPIC Hospital and the delegates were given a run-through with catheter and wire handling know-how and step-by-step TAVI instructions. Following this Hands on TAVI was done by Delegates including myself. I was given the opportunity of doing the TAVI as first operator with hand holding by Dr. Abhishek Rajpopat and I must admit it was TRUE MENTORSHIP at its best. Dr. Anil Jain arranged Bovine Heart Models which were used for TAVI implant and training on TAVI Explant using Root Enlargement techniques. This again was a very well thought of concept by Dr. Jain keeping in mind that TAVI Explant is the fastest growing procedure in the US. The next Skill Enhancement Programme by the IACTS EC was conducted at INDIA VALVES in Chennai. The TACS (TRANSCATHETER Aortic valve replacement for Cardiac Surgeons) at India Valves Chennai was held on the 12th of September. This course was conducted by Dr. A B Gopalamurugan (Structural Heart Cardiologist), Dr. Prashant Vaidyanath (Structural Heart Interventionalist) and Dr. Kendra Grubb (Head of Structural Heart Interventions, Emory University). The latter are proudly Cardiac Surgeons of global repute. There was a separate hall dedicated for workshop on TAVR training wherein 50 surgeons registered. This workshop included interpreting CT images using 3Mensio, Decision Making, introduction to Wireskills, Hands-on use of simulators, workshop on percutaneous peripheral vascular closure devices and exposure to all the TAVI valves in India. I have to tell the members here that both the workshops were led by structural cardiologists and the attendees got a certificate from the IACTS for the same. The IACTS Vision is to provide our surgeons "Certification" for these workshops.

Going forward these credit hours, will be of help in day-to-day clinical practice of the art. I must reiterate, Heart Team approach in Structural Heart Interventions needs to be implemented in true letter and spirit.



Let's take the lead as surgeons to implement this in India. I strongly appreciate the efforts of Dr. A B Gopalamurugan and Dr. Abhishek Rajpopat, Structural Heart Cardiologists, who are taking the lead in training Cardiac Surgeons. We will definitely go ahead with more such TAVI workshops mentored by Structural Interventionalists and we assure you of a high-quality learning experience.

We are planning a Peripheral vascular intervention Hands-on workshop for our members in the last weekend of October in Patiala, Punjab and in the coming months Workshops in Robotic Cardiac Surgery and Heart/Lung transplantation at New Delhi among other activities.

We are excited to collaborate with our senior members who are coming forward to mentor the fellow members in focussed skill sets. This has been seen by the bountiful number of IACTS Fellowship programmes which have been initiated in Coronary, MICS, Robotic, Heart and Lung Transplant and Thoracic Surgery. Training should be India centric for Indians by Indians. We have world-class mentors in house and we are definitely pushing for more training centres to be enlisted in the coming months. Going forward, we will be engaging with our young Residents via an official IACTS Residents Wing which will help our young budding surgeons to participate in the IACTS activities including Database and Research in a more active and structured manner. ### IACTS Databse Report

## From the Chief of Operations - IACTS Database Dr. B. R. Jagannath

Bhadrapada month marks the beginning of the festival season in India, and the beginning is by worship of lord Ganesa on the fourth day. Lord Ganesa was the scribe used by Maharishi Veda Vyas, to write the Mahabharata. The scribe's condition was that nothing should be uttered without understanding, and there should be no pauses in the dictation. Sticking to these two ideals the IACTS Database has been striving to give you accurate information regarding the practice of cardiac surgery in Bharat.

What started as a pilot project in 2021, with 10 centres, of which only 5 were diligent in data entry, it has now grown to include 26 centres and has 32107 case records, of which 24846 are adults and 7261 are paediatric heart surgeries. The modules currently active are adult CABG, valves, and congenital surgeries. It is proposed to add thoracic, aortic, and transplant modules shortly.

The data captured includes demography and surgical details as well as immediate outcome details. The database committee gratefully acknowledges the untiring efforts of all the contributors but recognises the efforts of GKNM Hospital Coimbatore, Jayadeva Heart Institute Bangalore and Fortis Hospital Delhi, in particular, for their diligence in data entry.

We are revamping the database webpage where we will post the overview as well as the previous month's entries as a snapshot. The detailed reports can be accessed only after logging into the IACTS website.

We welcome the new IACTS fellows in various disciplines of cardiac surgery, and they are being actively involved in database management. They

will be able to generate their experience logbook from the database. The residents could generate their log book from the database provided they have diligently entered data, and all this is certified by the IACTS President and secretary and the Database chairman.

We welcome initiatives to collaborate and analyse data, as well as write papers or develop research projects, we would be in a position to provide anonymised centre non-specific data for analysis, now that we have a good number. In the case of advanced research projects requiring additional specific data, we would be able to identify patients, centres and request for additional data, however the data will be anonymised and centre-agnostic before being provided to the end user.

I encourage you all to please visit the database web page, and put in your comments and suggestions. I would be very happy to assist you in joining the database.

What are you waiting for; in collective responsibility and collective reasoning lies our progress as cardiac surgeons!

### Transcatheter Aortic Valve Implantation

8th to 9th September, 2024: In collaboration with IACTS, the Skill Enhancement Programme - Transcatheter Aortic Valve Implantation at EPIC Hospital, Ahmedabad, gave Hands-On training in Trans Catheter Valve Replacement for Cardiac Surgeons. Under the leadership of Dr. Anil Jain, this certified course by the IACTS-Epic Hospital provided advanced training and mentorship for cardiac surgeons in India.

The aim was to improve the vantage point of the cardiac surgical fraternity in their practice and give the best possible clinical outcomes to their patients by implementing best practices in patient selection for this modality of treatment.

### TAVR Academy for Cardiac Surgeons

12th to 14th September, 2024: The India Valves Conference, initiated by IACTS in 2019, in association with cardiologists and surgeons to train surgeons, offered didactic lectures and hands-on training in the field of TAVR. Under the leadership of Dr. A. B. Gopalamurugan and team, this initiative to educate and update cardiac surgeons in the field of Transcatheter Valve Therapies was held at ITC Grand Chola, Chennai.

#### Residents Forum

## **Obituary**



**Dr. Panangipalli Venugopal** 8th October 2024

Born in Rajahmundry, Andhra Pradesh, Dr. Venugopal graduated from AIIMS as the best outgoing student. He then got the MS (surg.) degree from PGI Chandigarh. He continued his education as he joined M.Ch. Course in Cardiothoracic surgery under Prof. Gopinath. In 1968 he completed his M. Ch and was appointed lecturer in the same department. In 1972 he went to train with Prof Subramaniam in Buffalo, NY, and then with Dr. Denton Cooley in Texas. He returned to AIIMS in 1974 and began to develop the surgical techniques along with Dr. Prusty who trained with Dr. Donald Ross and Dr. IM Rao who returned after training with Sir Brian Barratt Boyes in New Zealand. The open-heart surgery program began to produce good results with most surgeries including pulmonary and oesophageal procedures. When Prof Gopinath retired in 1982, he took over as the Head of Dept and progressed to Chief of Centre after Dr. Rajan Tandon retired. The M. Ch Program was now a 3-year course and many were trained in the department. The facility moved to a new and modern building in 1984. With his encouragement and support a state-of-the-art human heart valve and tissue bank was established at the centre in 1993, permitting complex procedures such as Ross procedures, homograft AVR/MVR, and RVOT reconstruction. He performed the first successful human heart transplant in 1994. He received the Padma Bhushan Award in 1995.

He helped the Sri Sathya Sai institute of Medical Sciences to establish a heart surgery program in Puttaparthy, (AP). Most of the AIIMS CTVS faculty contributed to developing and training staff from this institution. He took over as Director in 2003, and finally retired from AIIMS in 2007.

He has trained a large number of students who are heading departments in many institutions in the country. He is survived by his wife, Priya Sarkar, and a daughter. We offer our sincere condolences to the bereaved family and pray, May his soul Rest in Peace.

**Dr. Marthanda Varma Sankaran Valiathan**, a distinguished cardiac surgeon of the country, has left behind a legacy of excellence in the field of medicine.

The founder-director of Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology (SCTIMST), Dr. M.S. Valiathan passed away at the age of 90. Fondly remembered as a great inspiration to the cardiac fraternity, he was a professor under whose guidance and mentorship many a fine cardiac surgeon had passed.

Born in Mavelikkara, Alappuzha, Dr Valiathan's earned his medical degree from the University of Kerala in 1956, and was trained in training at Johns Hopkins University and the University of Liverpool. He was the former President of the Indian National Science Academy and the National Research Professor.

Professor Valiathan received numerous accolades: the Padma Vibhushan (2005), the Padma Shri (2002), the Dr. B. C. Roy National Award, the Hunterian Professorship of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, the Chevalier of the Order of Palmes Académiques from the French Government, the Dr. Samuel P. Asper Award for International Medical Education from Johns Hopkins University, and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Indian Medical Association.

His innovative work in developing medical devices, such as the disposable blood bag and the tilting disc heart valve, laid the foundation for India's medical devices industry. The great academician had gifted the nation with the Chitra Heart Valve Prosthesis, which saved many lives due to its efficient and cost-effective treatment to patients suffering from heart valve damage due to rheumatic heart disease. This genius innovation is truly a testament of his love to the nation and its people.
